A Collective Effort to Serve Those Who Served

The Veterans Resource Fair was designed as a one-stop hub where veterans could access meaningful resources, benefits, and supportive services—all under one roof. The event brought together more than 70 resource providers and over 10 sponsors, creating a coordinated network of care that addressed immediate needs and long-term wellbeing.

Veterans received direct on-site services including medical checks, free haircuts and grooming, professional men and women's work clothing, manicures, food distribution, and DVNF Comfort Kits with hygiene and comfort products. Dedicated DVNF staff and volunteers guiding veterans through registration, on-site navigation, and personalized support across the venue.

Beyond these immediate services, veterans were connected with providers specializing in healthcare, mental health, employment, training, financial and legal assistance, housing support, and community engagement programs. This comprehensive structure ensured that every veteran who walked in was met with dignity, compassion, and actionable help.

DVNF is grateful to the ADA Foundation for its continued partnership, not only at this year's SmileCon Comfort Kit pack-out and Resource Fair, but also for last year's collaboration at SmileCon 2024 in New Orleans during the Give Veterans a Smile initiative. This ongoing alliance reflects a shared mission to uplift veterans nationwide.

In total, hundreds of veterans were supported through dozens of on-site services and a deeply unified community effort. From DVNF staff to volunteers and vendor partners, every participant played a vital role in delivering a meaningful and dignified experience for the veterans we proudly serve.





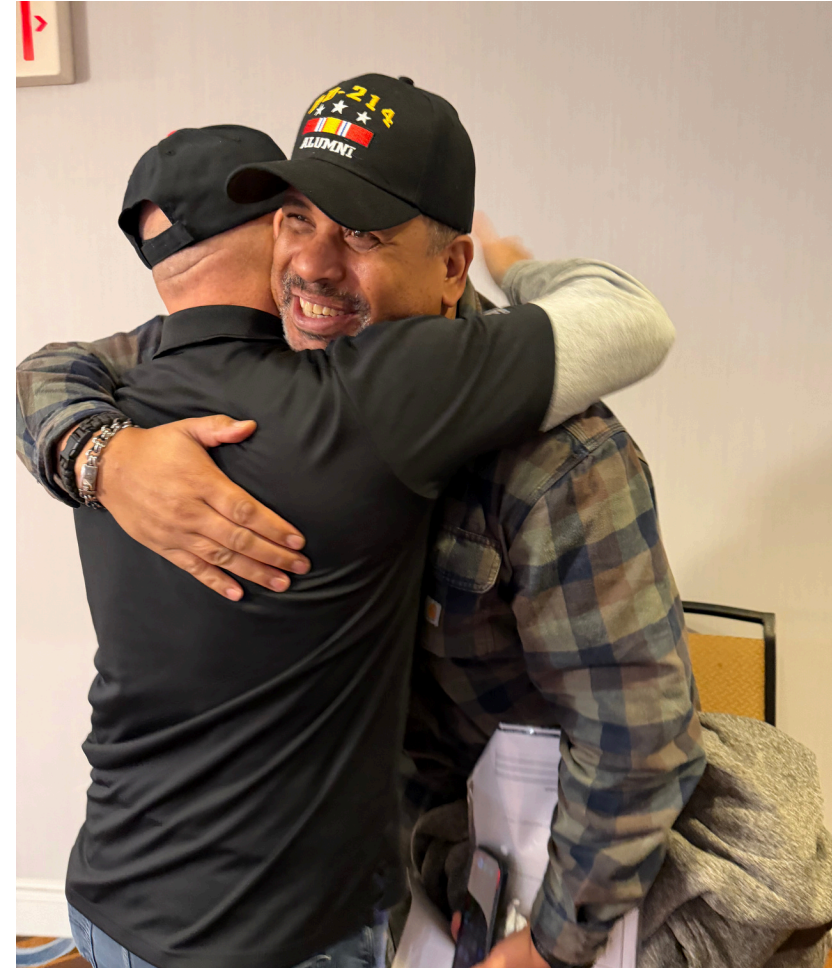
