OUR ANNUAL VETERANS RESOURCE FAIR CONTINUES TO GROW, YEAR AFTER YEAR...



On November 10th in Springfield, Maryland, the Disabled Veterans National Foundation once again witnessed the power of community in action. With the support of more than 29 dedicated volunteers and vendor partners, we proudly served over 385 registered veterans, along with more than 60 walk-in veterans who sought immediate assistance. This incredible turnout reflects the growing reach of our mission and the unwavering commitment of those who stand beside DVNF to ensure our Disabled and At-Risk Veterans are supported with dignity, respect, and compassion.
