



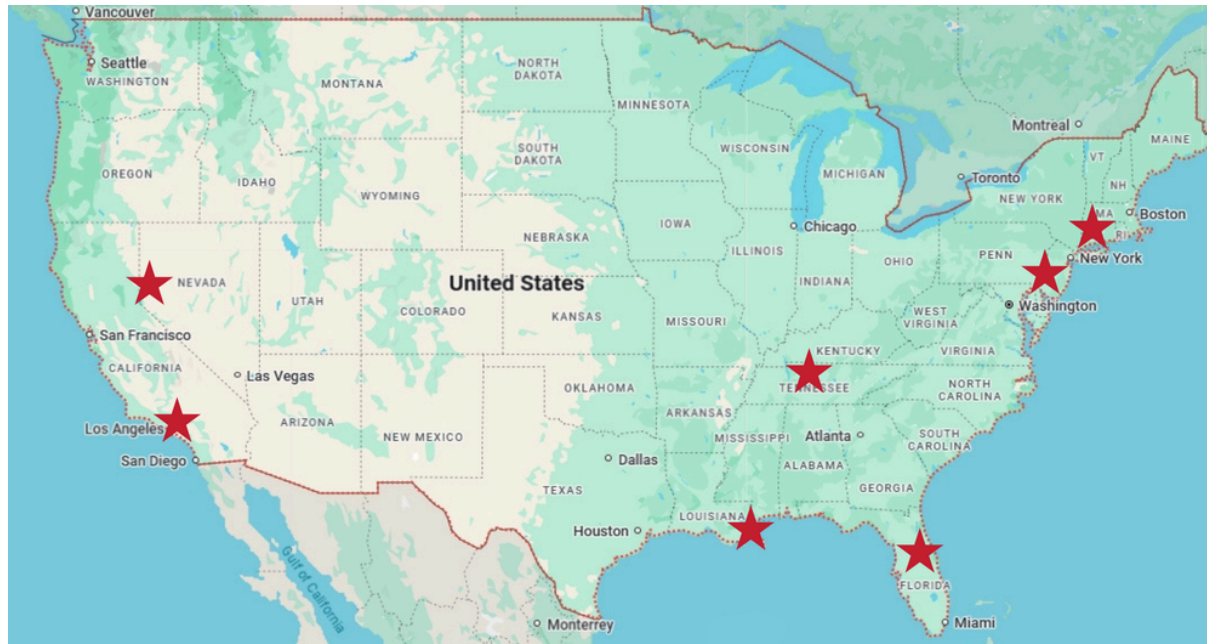
DVNF and the VA: Veteran Support in Action



The Disabled Veterans National Foundation (DVNF) partners with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and corporate sponsors to bring Comfort Kits, meals, and resources directly to veterans at VA hospitals nationwide. Each Grab-N-Go event provides immediate relief and connects veterans to ongoing support.

Veterans receive Comfort Kits with hygiene items, socks, t-shirts, food, and gift cards, along with meals and information on DVNF's programs: the Veterans Food Assistance Program (VFAP), Homeless to Housing (H2H), Grants to Provide Stability (GPS), and Mission Possible (MP). These resources help address food insecurity, housing needs, essential bills, and overall well-being.

From coast to coast, Grab-N-Go's reflect the strength of collaboration, and the commitment to honor those who served. Each year, this partnership reaches more VA hospitals, ensuring more veterans are met with dignity, respect, and care.

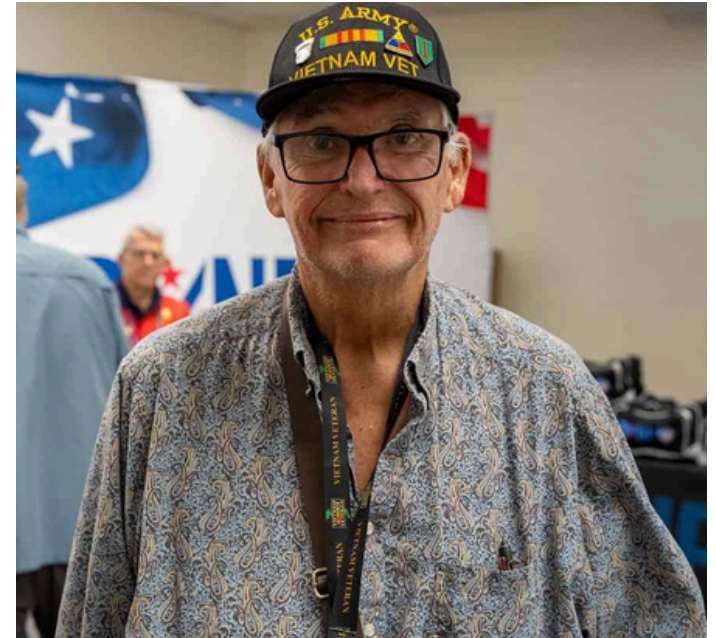


Nashville VA Medical Center May 28, 2026
